The Origin of the Months Memory Mass: One of the morals of civilization that became very significant for people going back to the stone age was the respect people had for the places they chose to bury their dead. These sites ware discovered with the remains of flower petals and the husks of corn, the flowers as a mark of respect and the husks of corn as food for the journey. This respect for the dead was manifested by 30 days of mourning and the custom was first established in the Old Testament where we read that the Israelites wept for Moses in the plains of moab for thirty days and all the house of Israel mourned for thirty days. It is good to remember the dead as it keeps us in touch with the goodness of people who were good to us. It helps to forgive where forgiveness is still lacking and makes us realize that all these people who touched our lives while they lived were God's gifts to us. This is the origin of the month's memory mass a crucial step in the mourning process.
