The Mass Intention for the weekend:

The priest saying mass on any day is only allowed to keep one mass stipend for himself and the other intentions included in that mass are to be sent off to the Bishop who distributes the offerings to the poor. As I have to keep a record of these it would be great if the donor could put the stipend in an envelope and the name and amount on same. This would leave my conscience free.

Is Death the final end? For the early Christians their understanding of death was in stark contrast with what their Roman neighbours believed. The Christians believed that death was a birth into new life. This can be seen in the title they gave their burial places. While the Romans typically called a burial site a “Necropolis” meaning “City of the Dead” - the Christians gave their burial places a more hope-filled name. They called them “Cemeteries” meaning “Sleeping Rooms”. The term reflected the distinctively Christian belief in the after life. Christians buried there were said to be simply “Asleep” in Christ.
