## **Church Notices**

This is the story about four people named Everybody, Somebody, Anybody and Nobody. There was an important job to be done and Everybody was sure that Somebody would do it. Anybody could have done it, but Nobody did it, Somebody got angry about that, because it was Everybody's job. Everybody thought Anybody could do it, but Nobody realized that Everybody wouldn't do it. It ended up that Everybody blamed Somebody when Nobody did what Anybody could have done.

- When Christmas was ILLEGAL:
- On the 21st December 1620 the 'May flower' landed at Plymount Massachusetts and its passengers became known as "Pilgrims". These Pilgrims were actually "Separatist Puritans" who were members of a reform movement within the Anglican Church and these people believed that the Anglican Church needed to purify itself from Roman Catholic practices and influences. The Puritans formed upon the Celebration of Christians because of all the externals—Christmas Trees, Crib Scenes, Decorations, Gift Giving which they felt were born of pagan customs rather than rooted in Scripture. In fact the Puritans in Massachusetts Bay Colony actually outlawed Christmas. From 1659 to 1681 anyone caught celebrating Christmas in the Colony would be fined 5 shillings. However 240,000,000 Americans celebrate Christmas.
