A Structure for Prayer

- 1. Choose a Time make a definite time dedicated only to prayer
- 2. Choose a place It should be free from distractions
- 3. Go over the basic facts in your mind Do not focus on your problems but on the truths revealed in God's Word.
- 4. Praise God He is worthy of all praise
- 5. Ask God Questions Ask him about his kingdom and about the scripture you have selected
- 6. Listen for an answer—Expect to have God within yourself and the scripture you have chosen.
- 7. Respond to God Do this by asking forgiveness praying for wisdom and praying for others.

One of the major problems that people have when they do set time aside to pray is they have to deal with distractions. When we try to get rid of these they get more entrenched in our mind and we can't get rid of distractions. There is a remedy for this. Anthony de Mello believes that you have to learn to love these distractions and when you do they distractions lose their power. He gives the example of a person who comes to a "Guru" to get help with his prayer time. De Mello lived in India and there are a lot of swamps in the countryside full of frogs. So the "Guru" advised him that as long as he considered the frog to be a distraction he would have no peace of mind while praying. The croaking of frogs occupied his mind and unless he could learn to love the distraction (the frogs) he was going nowhere. So the man learned to love the croaking of the frogs and soon afterwards they ceased to be a distraction for him.
