1.	Humans are depraved. Faith alone saves.	Human nature since Adam's fall is utterly depraved.	The pope is not the universal authority over the whole church
2.	The Bible, not the Pope is the centre of authority within the Church. Individual interpretation of the Bible is open to everybody.	Some are predestined for salvation others for hell. Christ died only for the elect who cannot resist God's grace.	The King is the head of the Church of England and so can change the rules of the Church
3.	Accepts Baptism and the Eucharist and believes in the real presence during the Eucharist	Accepts only Baptism and the Eucharist but believes Christ is only spiritually present during the Eucharist. Encourages bible reading, sobriety thrift capitalism and strict Sabbath	Accepts all of the seven sacraments
4.	Rejects holy days, feast days, honouring of saints, indulgences the Rosary, monasticism and the other five sacraments	Rejects whatever cannot be found in the Bible, vestments, altar images, paintings, organs,	Accepts most Roman Catholic Beliefs and practices.
