As in most rural schools 1st and 2nd class work together on their subjects. This means in the context of the "pandemic" the children who are to receive Holy Communion did not have class in 1st class from 12th March 2020 to June 2020. Their progress received a further blow when they finished for Christmas - until March 2021 as the 2nd class group boys and girls. It is important that these 1st communion class should be brought to mass over the next months to see what community worship is and having been present with their families they can participate in the Eucharist.

Ways to prepare for 1st Holy Communion



- 1. Talk to your child about his or her Baptism
- 2. Talk with your child about your own First Holy Communion Experiences
- 3. Celebrate meals together as a family
- 4. Spend time in family prayer
- 5. Help your child understand the Mass and how to participate in the Mass
- 6. Make a decision to attend Mass and by doing so help to form the child's understanding of what being a parishioner entails

7. Perhaps you could encourage your pre-communion child to bring you to mass on a weekday as a contrast to the larger weekend experience

Confirmation = Strengthening

The word Sacrament comes from the term "sacermysterion" which means a "holy sacred rite" The Roman army had special elite troops who committed themselves to their commander and who took a binding oath to their commander by which they were prepared to die in protecting their leader and to encapsulate this loyalty they used the term SACRAMENT. The lives of the early Christians were always under pressure from the Roman Government and so all new members took on the sacraments as an indication of their commitment to Jesus The Sacrament of Confirmation on our Part is inviting us to become committed to
