Visitation of the sick and homebound: First Friday 6th August - morning time **Saint Laurence** was born on 31/12/225AD to Oventius and Palentir who were both martyrs themselves. On August 6th 258 the pope named Sixtus 11 was beheaded after being caught celebrating mass. So Laurence was next in command and the Emperor Valerian demanded that he bring the treasures of the Church and hand them over within three days. So Laurence brought the sick, the poor the blind with him and said to the Emperor 'these are the treasures of the Church'. In a rage Laurence was condemned to be placed on a hot Gridiron. After he had long suffered on the Gridiron he cheerfully declared "I am well done on this side, turn me over" St. Laurence is the patron saint of chefs and comedians.
