The significance of the Dove in our understanding of ConfirmationWhen we read about the creation of the world in the book of Genesis we see that at the end of each day of creation God looks at what he has created and he says "This is Good". Most of our lives we spend trying to remember this reality that because God has made us we are good. Religion is trying to help us deal with the forces of evil that rob us of this sense of security. As we are at the top of all creation we have access to the world of symbolism that nothing else in creation has. The word symbolism is a Greek word which means "that which draws together" (the opposite of diabolism" that which draws apart"). When we reach 12 or 13 our mind has access to a whole world of symbolism. And so in the symbolism of Confirmation preparation we are introduced to the Dove, Fire, Wind and Breath. The unlimited possibilities of happiness confered on Adam and Eve came to a tragic end when Cain murdered his brother Abel, and things got worse. The flood that overcame Noah was perceived to be a punishment from God but there was still hope. As it rained for 40 days and 40 nights and all land disappeared the "end" was staring Noah in the face. However he got a brain wave and took a raven and allowed him to go free, but he returned because the Ark was the only solid thing he could land on. Then he decided he would release a dove, but the same happened she returned to the security of the Ark. After some time he released the dove and this time she returned with a leaf in her beak, indicating that some land had re - emerged from the flood. This return was of great significance but of greater significance, was what was in her beak - the branch was that of an olive tree and of course "olive branch" has become a universal symbol for peace making. For the writer of this part of the book of Genesis this was God telling the people that He had forgiven them for drifting away from him
