In Ancient Rome February 14th was a holiday to honour Juno, Goddess of women and marriage and the next day began the festival of 'Lupercalia' when the names of girls were written on slips of paper and placed in jars. Young men would draw a girls name and they would be partners for the festival. St. Valentine would marry some of these young couples against the wishes of the Emperor Claudius who believed those weddings were the cause of many men refusing to leave their families and enlist as soldiers. St Valentine was martyred in the reign of the Emperor Claudius on the 14th February 269 A.D.
