- ◆ If we are filled with a feeling of proud entitlement, then the good things in life are not gifts but simple what we have coming to us. As Robert Emmons puts it for thousands of years the prevailing crew has been that an overly high opinion of oneself is the chief cause of ingratitude, and that the ungrateful person appears to be characterised by a sense of excessive self importance, arrogance vanity and an unquenchable need for admiration and approval. This is usually, called pride. Pride in its disordered sense of the term is a obstacle to gratitude. Proud or narcissistic people feel no gratitude because they act as if everything they enjoy is the result of their own work or something to which they are entitled. The proud person refuses to acknowledge dependence or others or indebtedness to others but only a sense of entitlement. If one is entitled to everything then one is thankful for nothing. For good reason, pride is listed first among the 7 deadly sins.

Feast of Pentecost:

As a Jewish festival, the feast of Pentecost was celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover. It's start on the fiftieth day caused it to be called Pentecost which derives from the Greek word for fifty. The Israelite farmer was expected to dedicate a portion of the first fruits of his grain to the Lord as a token of recognition that it is God who protects the crops. So the church used this Jewish Festival of Pentecost to celebrate the first fruits, a new harvesting of souls.
