- Fr John Walsh (Limerick) will celebrate a family tree healing mass with Eucharistic blessing in St Brigid's Church, Killygarry on Monday June 20th at 7.30pm. Water, Salt and Oil will be blessed on the night. Confessions will be available. All welcome
- We meet the man Melchizedek in the 1st reading today. He is not a figure we come across very often but he was king of Salam which would change its name to Jerusalem. Melchizedek appears as the first priest mentioned in the Bible and many students of the Bible have seen him as the foreshadowing of Jesus Christ. Melchizedek's sacrifice was extraordinary in that it involved no animals. He offered bread and wine as Jesus would at the last supper. Melchizedek's sacrifice ended with a blessing. The Hebrew word of Benediction is Berakah which means bending the knee as a accompaniment to worship and giving thanks or praise to God. The Latin word benidicere has replaced the Hebrew word Berakah and it means to speak well of. As we know later Benediction would become an elaborate devotional service in its own right. The core of Benediction is the blessing of the congregation with the consecrated host contained within the monstrance.
