During the last week St. Peter has appeared in the Readings. We can presume this is to confirm Peter as the leader of the Apostles and he healed many people of their various ailments and in some cases he crossed the deep racial division that would plague their country even up to this point in time. It is known that Peter was executed as a result of the great fire of Rome in 64 A.D He is believed to be buried outside the city walls in the Vatican hill and his followers kept an eye on the spot. Several hundred years ago the Emperor built a great Basilica over the spot where Peter was buried. In the 1940's archaeologists dug under the Basilica wondering what they might find. Directly under the main altar they found some bones which near by some graffiti identified as the relics of St. Peter. In the 1960's these bones were given a thorough over going. This investigation showed that the bones were of a man in his sixties. The only bones missing were the feet which would give rise to the story that Peter was crucified upside down.
