♦ Modern Day China is ruled by an Atheistic Government in clear opposition to Christianity. So there was great hope when in 2018 an historic deal was reached between the Vatican and the Peoples Republic of China. This deal was seen as a breakthrough in a struggle for human rights and religious liberty. It was hoped that the lives of the 12 million Catholics living in china would be freed from the oppression of the Chinese authorities. Just five years on it would appear that such optimism was short lived because in that period China has tightened restrictions on the rights of Christians who represent about five per cent of the population of 1.4 Billion people while violating its initial agreement with the Vatican which was renewed in 2020 and then in 2022. All the members of the Chinese Communist Party are obliged to be atheists and the Government of China is determined to "Sinicise" Christianity by retranslating the bible.
