The Day of Easter

As the Christian religion moved north from the Mediterranean it came in contact with the German tribes and this tribes worshipped a pagan goddess and this goddess was the Saxon goddess of spring and offspring Easter. Whenever possible the missionaries tried not to interfere too strongly with entrenched and popular customs. Rather quietly and often ingeniously they attempted to transform pagan practices into Christian ceremonies that harmonised with Christian Doctrines. For several decades Easter was variously celebrated on a Friday Saturday or on Sunday. In order to sort out this for once and for all the Emperor Constinstine convened a council in Nicaea. For at this council it was decided that Easter should be celebrated on the First Sunday, after the first full moon, after the spring equinox. As a result of the decision in 325 is astronomically bound never to fall earlier than March 22nd or later than April 25th.
