♦ The fact that Jesus is hardly mentioned outside the gospels is not surprising. When non-Christians did refer to him, they obviously saw him as a troublemaker. The writings of two famous Romans that have come down to us illustrate this. Pliny writing in AD 112 to the Emperor Trajan complains that there was a slump in the agricultural markets because people were no longer buying beasts for sacrifice. This was the fault of people called Christians who formed a secret society and refused to offer sacrifice to the God-Emperor. The Roman historian Tacitus writing in the beginning of the 2nd century wrote that the Christians had been made a scapegoat for the great fire of Rome in the reign of Nero (19th July 64 AD). Their founder was a criminal who had been executed by Pontius Pilate thirty years, or so earlier. Unfortunately the death of the ringleader had not stopped the mischief.
