Basic Elements for Religion

1. All religions recognise something or somebody beyond this world of senses and scientific measurement.
2. Each Religious offers guidelines and advice on how to behave and so draw close to this Other.

4. Most Religions express themselves in the written word—epics or scriptures of some form.
5. Believers often came together to express their faith in worship and celebration in sacred buildings and places.
6. All Religions address the problem of suffering, and the mysteries of good and evil.
7. All Religions hold special ceremonies at the time of death and grapple with the question of life after death
8. Believers celebrate certain high points in their lives, notably rites of passage, with special religions rituals.
