The kind of knowing that we seek is not only which leads to charity of thought and articulation. We seek to lead the children to become the kind of people who see the world around them and all that is happening in it through the eyes of faith and where interpretations of what is happening in it through the eyes of faith. Religious education lead children to respond to God here and now with faith love and gratitude. Therefore we must communicate the Christian message to them in a manner appropriate to their age, stage, of faithful development and life experience. In the area of religious faith, it is not just what we know but how we respond to that knowledge and put the knowledge into practice. This is usually called **CATECHESIS coming from the Greek word KATEKAESIS meaning to** echo this listening to the teacher in the echo picks up the information, makes it personalised and grows in the stories he/she learns from the teacher and the text. Today Catholic religious education invites children to investigate interpret and analyse religious concepts and to apply them to their own lives in such a way that they just don't learn about religion but they learn from religion for their lives in the world.
