Conversation About the Future of The Church in Crosserlough Parish

Last Tuesday evening, the parish community gathered in the Clubrooms in Kilnaleck to discuss Bishop Hayes' pastoral letter concerning the future of the church in Kilmore Diocese. A productive conversation took place with specific reference to Crosserlough Parish. Voices were heard and views were shared. The input of the participants was noted and the details have been forwarded for consideration at diocesan level. We thank everyone for their meaningful engagement with the process to date and we look forward to further discussions in due course.

The Churches Prayer for the Faithful Departed:

For the souls of the faithful departed implores eternal life not only for the disciples of Christ who have died in his peace but for the dead whose faith is known to God. The just encounter God in death. He calls them to himself so as to share eternal life with them. No one however can be received into God's friendship and intimacy without having been purified of the consequences of personal sin. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned. The Church formulated her doctrine of faith on Purgatory especially at the Councils of Florence and Trent'
