St. Paul Readings: We will be having readings from St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians for the next number of weeks. Those people who lived in Ephesus are now part of Turkey. The letter is written obviously from prison during the first two years of his captivity in Rome. The letter is not dealing with the problems of any particular church but informing his mind for the benefit of all. At the core of this message that it is God's plan to bring not only the Church put the whole world into perfect harmony with himself through Christ. Now we know what it means to pass from death to life from the living death of self-centred ness to the new life which is central with Christ in God. Christian behaviour springs from a realisation of who we are and why we are here. So we must use our time to the best advantage and try to know the will of God in our own lives.

Feast of St. James: Thursday 25th July: The feast day of St. James, who was the brother of St. John the Evangelist. He accompanied Jesus on the Mount of Transfiguration and the experience of the agony in the Garden, and in this James formed the "Inner" three with Peter and John. After the persecution of St. Paul of the newly formed Christian grouping in Jerusalem, St. James travelled to Spain where he preached the "Gospel". When the persecution eased off somewhat James returned to Jerusalem where eventually he was put to death by Herod, he was beheaded with a sword. Some of those Christians he had preached to in Spain brought back his body and buried the dismembered body in a place made very popular recently, the place 'Compostella' (the field of stars) Santiago (St. James). This place of veneration of St. James attracts people from all over the world, who walk great distances as part of a voluntary penance.
